Spiritual Pilgrimages of Peacemaking—An Interfaith Retreat

Spiritual Pilgrimages of Peacemaking is the title of a one-day Interfaith retreat offered on Saturday, February 2 from 10 AM to 4 PM at Erdman Conference Center of Princeton Theological Seminary, located at 12 Library Place in Princeton. It will draw on the richness of a wide range of faith traditions to engage participants in tapping a variety of spiritual resources in their pilgrimages of peacemaking. The retreat is co-sponsored by Fellowship in Prayer and the Coalition for Peace Action, both based in Princeton.

Dr. Walter Wink, leading scholar on the non-violence of Jesus; acclaimed author; Professor Emeritus of Biblical Interpretation at Auburn Theological Seminary and former professor at Union Theological Seminary will be the keynote speaker. Dr. Wink will be joined by his wife, June Keener Wink, who also taught at Auburn, and who will lead the group in artistic expression of the integration of mind, body and spirit.

The day will begin with a multi-faith prayer service, and SiriOm Singh and his group of musicians will share devotional music intended to “open the heart, elevate the mind and create peace.” Anyone interested in deepening one’s spiritual grounding for peacemaking is encouraged to attend.
